During the year, JRAC hosted quarterly meetings to maintain and inform our network of members. These meetings featured a variety of topics that provided relevant and timely information. JRAC operates as a streamlined organization and continues to work with sponsors throughout the community to secure partnerships for funding and programs. 2014 STEWARDS OF THE RIVER

The James River Advisory Council recognized three outstanding individuals with its annual Stewards of the River Awards in an April ceremony at the Deep Run Recreation Center in Henrico County. Nominated by JRAC members, those selected have shown uncommon dedication and commitment to the James River. Recipients need not be JRAC members. Please read about the recipients throughout the pages of this annual report.

In its 15th year, the James River Regional Cleanup, held Sept. 13, demonstrated the continual need for such efforts and the outstanding partnerships and volunteer spirit that make it so successful. More than 730 volunteers spent a morning clearing the shorelines and water of trash at 14 sites along the James River from Appomattox to Newport News. The volunteers collected 456 garbage bags of trash, 80 tires and 278 bags of recyclable materials.





CONNECTION

JRAC continued its rich tradition of sponsoring the James River Days series between April and October. James River Days provides organizations throughout the region opportunities to connect by collectively promoting their river-related programs and events. James River Days has grown from a month-long celebration to one spanning seasons, and this past year featured many new programs focused on recreation, education, history and the environment. In its 20th year, the brochure featured 126 programs from 46 sponsors that were enjoyed by almost 340,000 attendees. New in 2014, JRAC organized James River Week to highlight events and activities related to the river. The 15th Annual James River Regional Cleanup kicked off a weeklong celebration of the James. In addition to the cleanup, James River Week included fun and educational programs and events for all ages, including a guided paddle, a river cruise to search for sturgeon, a history event, and dining and social events.

Suzette Lyon Community Partnership Award

Suzette continually demonstrates her dedication to improving the environment. Her work with the Reedy Creek Coalition empowered landowners to curb stormwater runoff by installing rain gardens, rain barrels and conservation landscaping. Suzette also led an effort to remove invasive species and protect our river and park habitat. She is a tireless Richmond Tree Steward who organizes community events and educational courses.

HERITAGE

For more than a decade, JRAC has sponsored the Diversity on the River

Series, a summertime lecture series celebrating the role of diversity in the history

of the James River. The latest program included a lecture about the important Battle

of New Market Heights in Henrico County, where on Sept. 29, 1864, U.S. Colored

Troops met some of the Army of Northern Virginia's most veteran units. For their valor

in this engagement, 14 African-American soldiers were awarded the Medal of Honor,

the highest military award.



ECONOMIC VITALITY

Thousands of people rely on a healthy and accessible James River for their livelihoods.

JRAC members and partners work year-round to bring attention to the river's valuable contributions to local and state economies. As a way of thanking the community for its support, JRAC hosts the annual James River Parade of Lights. The event's 22nd year marked a record turnout of more than 18,000 attendees. The parade featured a spectacle of 11 shimmering boats, cruising the river between the city of Richmond and Henrico and Chesterfield counties. This annual hallmark holiday event would not have been possible without the commitment, dedication and team effort of our volunteers.

Communication Award

Gay has been instrumental in communicating with citizens about stormwater runoff and how it influences water quality. Island Dam Walk portion of the Richmond Riverfront Plan implementation.


Ryan Abrahamsen, co-owner of
